The celebrated American naturalist, William Beebe (1877-1962) wrote: "When the last individual of a race of living things breathes no more, another Heaven and another Earth must pass before such a one can be again."

For the Institute for the Desert Arabian Horse the responsibility of preserving the horse of the Bedouin is thus made clear. We believe, the task is urgent today -- no less so than in the 1950s when Miss Jane Ott began a list of the horses proven in every line to trace directly to the deserts of Arabia.

We believe that the task is one that falls no more on one than on another. It is compelling work. Work that we all share. Work that will not wait.

The Institute for the Desert Arabian Horse invites you to attend its 2005 Symposium on Preservation -- February 18-20 -- in Phoenix, Arizona.

The work of preservation rests mainly on individuals, but its success depends on communities of commitment. So, the Institute for the Desert Arabian Horse is calling together people such as you -- committed individual breeders and representatives of breeding groups, historians, veterinarians, researchers and members of the scientific community -- to explore concrete and strategic ways of protecting the Desert Arabian in a threatening environment.

The 2005 Symposium goal is at once simple and vastly complex: To lay the foundation for strategies that will ensure the future for the Desert Arabian horse.

At the most elemental level, we will come together seeking practical ways to protect and conserve those noble horses that have been placed in our care. The Symposium will assess the prevailing conditions in specific breeding groups, historical and scientific research and the wider community of Arabian breeders. It will give us an opportunity to consider many of the issues involved in managing small populations for the maintenance of genetic viability.

We understand that there is no one single, simple protocol for conservation and preservation. Still, there are skills, principles and tools that are characteristic of all effective conservation and preservation programs. At the Symposium we will begin to examine those concrete ways in which breeders, breeding groups and others can -- together and individually -- advance the preservation and protection of the horse of the desert Bedouin.

The 2005 Symposium on Preservation is first in a series of events hosted by the Institute for the Desert Arabian Horse in North America and abroad, the end result of which will be a fully developed, collaborative and international agenda for preservation. We want you to be a part of this historic gathering.

On behalf of the Institute and its Board of Directors, I extend an earnest invitation for you to participate in the 2005 Symposium on Preservation. The weekend promises a rewarding time of forthright sharing, robust discussion and challenging planning for the years ahead.

Symposium Details:

Our inaugural **Symposium on Preservation** will be held February 18-20, 2005, at the historic Hotel San Carlos in downtown Phoenix, Arizona. Participants will explore the current state of conservation and opportunities for cooperation and collaboration among breeders, users, historians, researchers and other equine experts. A key product of this first symposium will be an agenda for action on behalf of the original Desert Arabian horse. For those who are unable to attend in person, the Institute will be seeking input through an open, on-line forum that will be available on this website in early January. That input will be incorporated into the working sessions in Phoenix.

Schedule

Friday evening's opening meeting will feature speakers whose remarks assess the current state of conservation. Saturday will be devoted to working sessions to identify areas of common interest and to set a collaborative agenda for the future, followed by a banquet. Sunday morning will conclude with summary sessions and a report on planned future actions. **Speakers** who will address the symposium include **Joe Ferriss, Bazy Tankersley, Michael Bowling and Edouard Aldahdah.**
